John Muir Birthday–Earth Day Celebration

MARTINEZ—The John Muir Birthday–Earth Day Celebration will highlight Muir’s contribution to the planet and the 40th anniversary of Earth Day. The event—which drew nearly 2,400 participants in 2009—will be held April 17th at the John Muir National Historic Site in Martinez.

The Celebration presents exhibits and fun activities for all ages. Our featured speakers include Brock Dolman, Director of the Water Institute, Occidental Arts and Ecology Center. Michael Muir, great grandson of John Muir, will greet guests with his magnificent horses. Participants will also enjoy live entertainment, tours of the historic home and grounds, nature activities, self-guided tours of the California Native Plant Garden, and much more. Admission is free to this regional event, which draws participants from all over the Bay Area.

Live music is by Extended Roots, Spinning Wheel, and The Black Irish Band of Sonora. Patty Helling will play the piano in the parlor of the Muir Home. Two silent auctions offer fun items to bid on, with the proceeds benefiting the John Muir Association, which presents the Celebration along with the National Park Service. The event is made possible by this year’s sponsors, including the City of Martinez and the Martinez Community Foundation.

“John Muir” will celebrate his birthday (as portrayed by National Park Service Ranger Frank Helling) by telling tales and sharing his birthday cake. Lunch and beverages will be available for purchase.

Known as the “Father of the National Park System,” Muir’s writings were key in preserving many of the stunning wild lands—mountains, rivers, canyons, shorelines, meadows, lakes and giant trees—that we enjoy today.
